QUEENSLAND WOMEN CHAMPIONING MORE AGE GROUPS FOR TOUCH FOOTBALL

When Simone Hepburn pulls on the maroon for the Women's over 45 Queensland team in the Touch Football State of Origin, she'll be celebrating an impressive 35 years in the sport.

Getting her first taste for representing Queensland as a schoolgirl, Hepburn has been a mainstay around the touch fields and will once again have the opportunity to represent Queensland in the over 45s

women's team at the 2022 Touch Football State of Origin.

Like many, touch football has been a family affair for Hepburn, with her dad, Paul Eggers, igniting her passion for the sport. Paul was one of the 'founding fathers' of Touch Football, being instrumental in the inception and development of Touch Football from the 70s and a life member.

"I grew up on the sidelines of touch, while Dad volunteered on the administrative side, and was inspired by all the legends of the 80s and 90s....the Norman's, the Notley's, the Brindall brothers, the McWhirter sisters.

"For me to represent Queensland feels like I'm respecting my dad's legacy and helping him keep up with the progress of the modern game"

"The friendships and laughs are what has kept me in the sport I now play and laugh with my kids or with girls I've known for more than 30 years.

"The other reason I keep playing is the continual challenge the sport brings as it evolves and always learning new ways to play, that keeps things interesting...and keeps the body moving.

"The game has changed a lot since the 90's and the way modern touch football is played now and the strategies and skills, it has evolved dramatically," she said.

With the final preparations being made for the ultimate grudge match, Queensland versus New South Wales, Hepburn said it will be about bringing energy and learning from each game.

"We are expecting them to play smart, come out hard and adapt from games 1 through to 3.

With touch football known for its ability to retain participants throughout their life, Hepburn represents the growing interest in playing touch among women 40 years and over.

Hepburn said it's thanks to Queensland women like Haylene Grogan, that more women have the chance to continue to compete at a high level in the sport in their older years.

"I've been inspired by the likes of Haylene to keep playing... she is a massive advocate for women in sport.

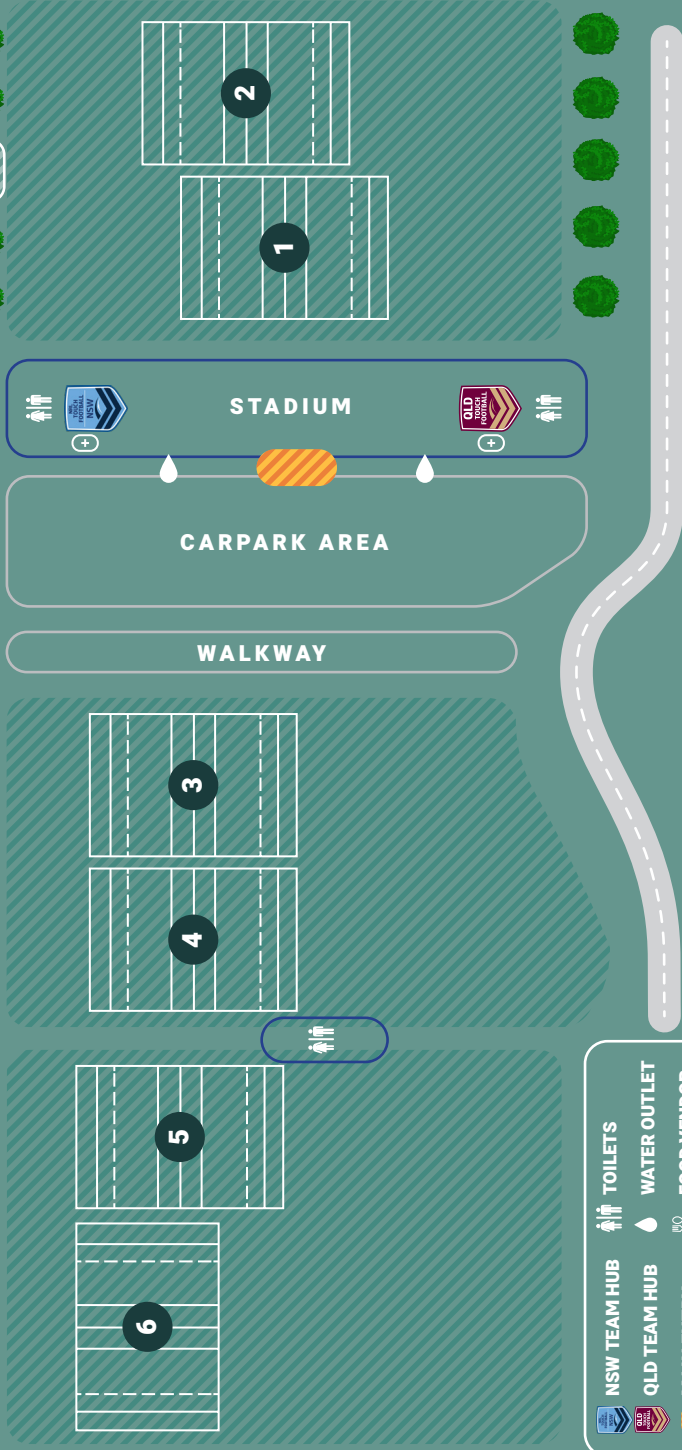
"She pushed for the first ever Queensland over 45 women's team and now herself will also line up again in the first over 50+ team."

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS



The New South Wales Touch Association (NSWTA) celebrates its 50th Anniversary, our Golden Jubilee in 2022.

It is quite a milestone to reach your 50th Anniversary, and it's appropriate to recognise this important time in our history. We have come a long way as an organisation since Ray Vawdon, and Bob Dyke first formed the New South Wales Touch Football Association with six (6) Affiliates and 1500 participants. So, it is only suitable that we recognise this milestone with several activities throughout the year. One of which has been the recently announced NSWTA Golden Jubilee Teams and Officials. We will also be playing in a retro uniform for this year's SOO series that will incorporate the names of all 1700 plus NSW

representatives who have represented our State over the years.

But where did we come from?

In 1968 the first official game of Touch Football as it was then known, was held in the traditionally strong Rugby League area of South Sydney. The South Sydney Touch Football Association was then founded and through the organisational structure of the intra-club sporting bodies at South Sydney Junior Rugby League, Bob Dyke and Ray Vawdon started a formal competition between a small number of teams at Snape Park, Kingsford.

Initially, the sport was intended simply to appeal to retired Rugby League players who wanted to stay fit through a "football type" sport.

During the late 1960s and early 1970s Touch Football Clubs and Associations were growing at a rapid rate in the ACT, NSW and QLD areas.

In 1972 the New South Wales Touch Association was formed. By 1973 it had six (6) Affiliated Associations with around 1500 Registered players. Not surprisingly the first Association to Affiliate was South Sydney. Cronulla was the second to join with Manly not too far behind. In 1973 Wagga Wagga Touch Association became the first country association to Affiliate with NSW Touch. By 1978 NSWTA President and founder, Ray Vawdon estimated there were 40,000 members in either Affiliated or Non-Affiliated clubs in Country and Metropolitan NSW.

The first interstate Touch Football game between NSW and Queensland occurred in 1973. It was played at Erskineville Oval on August 4th. We are happy to say that NSW won that clash 15-1. The likes of Owen Lane, Ron Hanson, and Reg Robinson all starred on the day.

Other early clashes included a full-field match between NSW and the touring Great Britain Lions Rugby League team in 1977. The early stars of the game were present.

Mick McCall, Terry Reynolds, and Peter Winchester all showed their class in the match played at Port Hacking Rugby Club.

In 1977 an opportunity was provided after the drawn Rugby League Grand final between St George and Parramatta to play an exhibition game. Rugby League was looking for a curtain raiser for the replay and approached Touch Football. Ex Rugby great Ken Irvine took the touch-field in front of 40,000 spectators who were not disappointed in the two representative matches provided for them.

Today our game is vastly different from that of the 60's and 70's. What hasn't changed though is the passion to represent NSW and wear the two blues. We will see that same passion again this weekend when we take on the old foe Queensland, as enemies on the field and as friends off the field.
